TRANSIENT STUDY - KNOWN DEFECT

Tis the season for transient study requests as we move into summer. We have been aware of issues displaying one-to-many or many-to-many equivalent credit for a few years now. An example would be a 4-credit lecture/lab course at another institution that will only display the 3-credit lecture at Charlotte (*essentially the first line of the transfer equivalency rule*). The 1-credit lab remains part of the equivalency, but does not display as part of that equivalency when students submit. The rules for transfer are built correctly and will be applied correctly after the student completes the coursework. This is the time of year when we receive multiple inquiries from advisors and students about this defect. It is unknown when a rewrite of the transient study tool will take place. Until then, we wanted to bring awareness to this issue. The <u>Transfer Credit Advisor</u> rules will be followed for known courses unless you specify a different handling with the Transient Study Petition.

PERSONAL PRONOUNS

We now have the ability to add personal pronouns for students, faculty, and staff in our Banner Self-Service environment. The Know Me Task Force has been reviewing this and is recommending which pages should display pronouns. We are sharing this with you in the event you have suggestions. To date, the pages that have been identified are Class Rosters, Grade Rosters, and Advisee Lists.
